TASTING NOTES

This 2015 Trecadis red blend is the second vintage we have produced and was created especially for you by our winemaker, Elyse Perry. One look at the color will reveal its dark red nature. Aromas of fresh Santa Rosa plums and white chocolate combined with cloves, cinnamon stick, and hints of juniper berry are a delight to the nose. It has strong, gripping tannins but is velvety and smooth in the mouth with delicious fruity flavors of black cherry, blackberry syrup and candied citrus. This full bodied, silky smooth wine is a testament to the art of blending flavors and textures. Liz suggests pairing this wine with foie gras, polenta with wild mushrooms or filet mignon with a cherry and wine reduction

TRECADIS: THE ART OF CATALAN TILE MOSAIC

The word Trecadis is the Catalan word for the art of combining broken shards of ceramic tiles, dinner plates and teacups and forming them into a unique mosaic. Antoni Gaudí used this art in his works during Catalan modernism in Barcelona in the early 1900's. There are many famous buildings and parks with Trecadis used as the main decorative style such as Park Güell, Casa Batlló and the sacred church of the Sagrada Família. We have used this art as an inspiration for combining our own blend of flavors and textures in the wine. Each year our winemaker, Elyse Perry, will create a special blend or mosaic of wine for your enjoyment. The artwork on the label is directly from photos taken at Park Güell. To create a special collection we have three different labels of this artwork to enhance the idea of the essence of Trecadis.

GREEN CERTIFICATION

This wine was produced from green certified vineyards. The "Lodi Rules for Sustainable Winegrowing Practices" is the most recognized third-party vineyard certification program in the industry. In order for a vineyard to be certified green under Lodi Rules, a grower must monitor and record their farming practices and achieve a minimum, quantifiable score in several categories.
